Current Learner Need Position

The principal learning and community needs that have been identified in the borough are as follows:

- **ESOL**

In Maybury and Sheerwater 68% of school children's home language is not English. Many of their parents speak good English or come from EU countries, but there are certain nationality clusters that do not fall into these categories, and will be victims of the 3 year residency rule, so will not benefit from free classes. Children need to comprehend well in their first language, before their second language comprehension can develop. Some parents might not read and write in their own language further stunting language development.

- **Lack of qualifications**

33% of residents in Maybury and Sheerwater, 32% in Kingfield and Westfield, and 31% of Old Woking residents have NO qualifications.

- **High levels of skills for life needs**

Three super output areas (SOAs) feature in the most deprived 20 in Surrey for education. This figure from the index of multiple deprivation (IMD) captures attainment by children and adults.

- **Higher Unemployment**

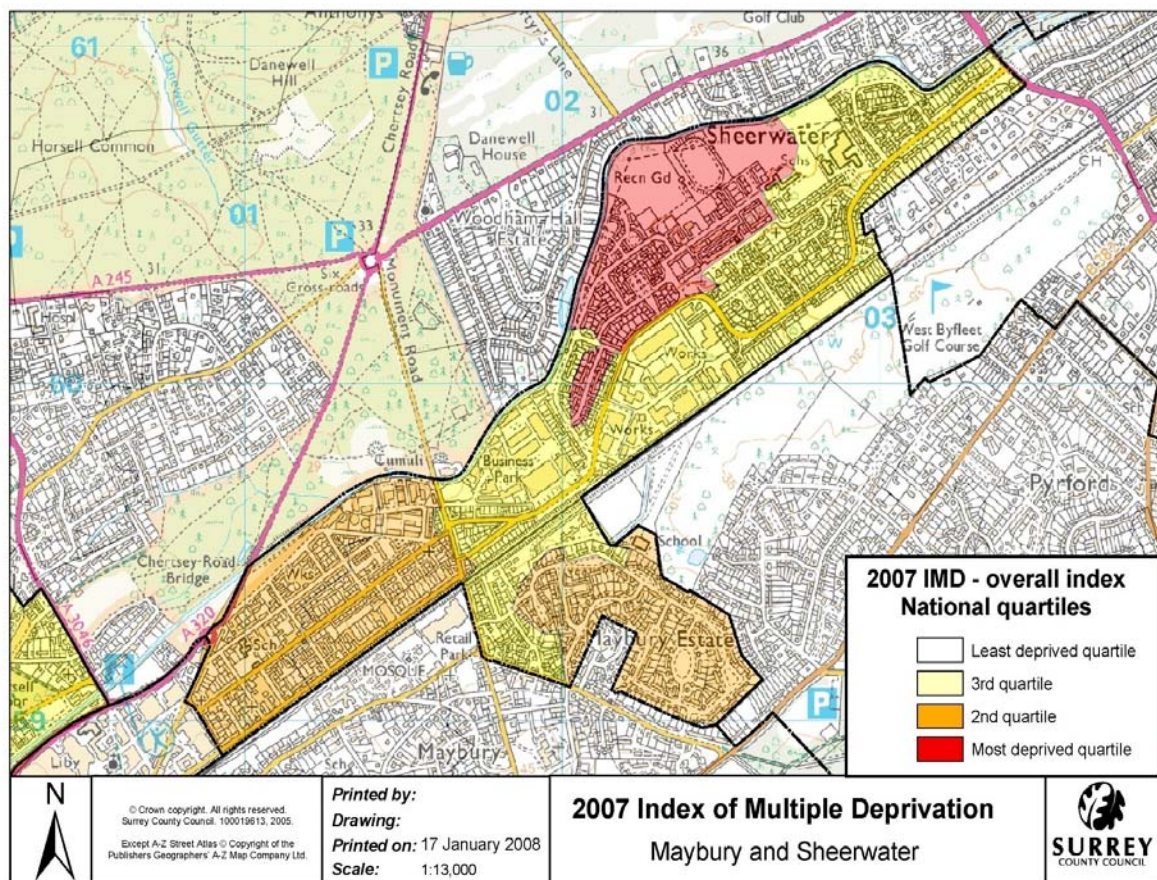

MAYBURY AND SHEERWATER WARD



Maybury and Sheerwater is a multi-cultural area. 34% of the residents are from minority ethnic origins and nearly 70% of Woking's Asian community lives within these wards.

According to the 2007 IMD, the summary results for Lower Level Super Output Areas in Sheerwater and Maybury Ward show that it is the ward with most need in Surrey.

WOKING 004F

Area: around Blackmore Crescent, Devonshire Avenue, Dartmouth Avenue, and St. Michael's Road including shops, Children's Centre and Community Centre.

Woking 004F was the 3rd most deprived SOA in Surrey in 2004, but in 2007 became the MOST deprived according to the indices of deprivation.

It ranks 1st in Surrey in:

- Income (3rd in 2004)
- Housing
- Employment
- Health

and features in the 20 highest need wards in Surrey for:

- Education (4th)
- (10th in 2004) Child Poverty (5th)
- Income Deprivation affecting Older People (3rd)



WOKING 004D

Area: Maybury Road along the Railway line, Walton Road, Board School Road, Boundary Road, including the Maybury Centre, Maybury Infants and The Corner House.

It features in the 20 highest need wards in Surrey for

- Income Deprivation affecting Older People (2nd)
- Employment (10th) as compared to 20th in 2004
- Health and Disability (4th) as compared to 23rd in 2004

WOKING 005B LAKEVIEW

Area: Bound by Sythwood and Marston Road, including Community Centre, local shop, Sythwood School and Children's Centre.

Woking 005D was the 5th most deprived SOA in Surrey in 2007IMD. It had ranked 7th in 2004.

It features in the 20 highest need wards in Surrey for:

- Income (2nd)
- Child Poverty (14th)
- Income Deprivation affecting Older People (4th)
- Employment (10th) as compared to 20th in 2004
- Health Disability (11th)
- Education, Skills and Training (14th)

In the 2004 IMD, Kingfield and Westfield was the 21st most deprived ward in Surrey and it featured in the 20 highest need wards in Surrey for:

- Income
- Education
- Child Poverty

By 2007, this was no longer the case but, it did still rank 20th in the Employment Deprivation Domain.



Neighbourhood learning needs in Woking

We need an infrastructure in Surrey that facilitates people to learn to read and write in their neighbourhood, otherwise we are never going to eradicate the low reading ability of many thousands of residents.

There is a high need for domestic abuse awareness and self esteem courses / support groups for people suffering domestic abuse; one specifically targeted at the diverse multi-cultural community in the locality would be beneficial.

Sheerwater:

There is demand at the Sheerwater Children's Centre for intermediate computer training; a progression from the basic OCN course which is delivered by Surrey County Council Adult & Community Learning termly.

Parents/carers also wish to access higher level English classes, as well as Literacy level 1 and level 2.

Many residents of Sheerwater are mental health service users, and user groups are being developed by the Cornerhouse and the Community Development Worker. Once capacity has increased it would be worthwhile to offer targeted learning including ICT, ESOL and other lifeskills.

Maybury:

There is a worry over the loss of the Maybury Centre crèche and how it will affect the classes offered at the centre by Woking and Guildford Colleges. There is a need to develop input that enables children and parents learning together.

Lakeview:

As for Maybury, there is a need to develop input that enables children and parents learning together.

A lot of good work being done in the 'Hands On' project is at risk because of lack of funding. The 'Talk and Learn' sessions being carried out with foreign language speakers are empowering for the participants and helping to build a strong community. These are at risk.

Old Woking, Kingfield and Westfield:

There is a need to develop input that enables children and parents to learn together. Now the Children's Centre is open at the Old Woking Community Centre, this will hopefully happen.
